

LIMITED GLOSSARY OF TERMS

double voucher:	The tenant in a writ of right; one who called in another to establish his warranty of title. In common recoveries there might be a single voucher or double vouchers.
groat:	Unit of English money used in Tudor times, = 4 pennies.
indenture:	Now-archaic word for a legal contract.
knave:	A deceitful and unreliable scoundrel.
old and sere:	(Especially for vegetation) having lost all moisture.
quiddet:	Subtlety; equivocation.
quillet:	Subtlety; nicety; quibble.
recognizance:	An obligation of record entered into before a court or magistrate, containing a condition to perform a particular act, such as making a court appearance; or a sum of money pledged to assure the performance of such an act.
stigmatical:	Having bodily marks, sores, or sensations of pain in locations corresponding to the crucifixion wounds of Jesus.
tenure:	Right to occupation of realty.
vacation:	Period between court terms, during which no case is heard.
